
WHAT IS DAP?

The Direct Access Program (DAP) of the Capital District Library Council (CDLC) allows library patrons in good standing to borrow materials directly from participating libraries throughout the Capital District. The program was developed by CDLC member librarians in 1974 and has continued to be a popular means of accessing the library resources of the area. The DAP is sanctioned by the CDLC Board of Trustees, but is not an official service obligation of CDLC institutional membership.

WHICH AREA LIBRARIES PARTICIPATE ?

Over sixty academic, public, law, medical, government, and corporate libraries with combined resources of more than 7 million books and 30,000 magazine and journal titles participate in DAP.

Many libraries permit all DAP card holders to borrow, while others have some restrictions as outlined in this brochure.

HOW CAN YOU USE THE PROGRAM?

Participating DAP libraries may issue DAP cards to currently registered patrons in good standing. If you are a student or faculty member of an academic library, obtain your card there. Your library can answer questions about the program. Some participating libraries may issue their own card in addition to the DAP card.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES:

Please remember that you are responsible for abiding by the rules and regulations of each of the libraries from which you borrow. Also be advised that each library reserves the right to rescind the DAP card of anyone who abuses the DAP borrowing privileges.

You are responsible for all materials borrowed until they are returned TO THE LENDING LIBRARY.

Library Participation Categories:

1. The library will lend directly to any adult DAP cardholder 19 years of age or older.
2. The library will lend directly to a DAP cardholder who is a professional researcher patron of a CDLC library, i.e., a person possessing academic degrees or engaged in research.
- 3a. The library will lend directly to faculty/staff of a CDLC academic institution.
- 3b. The library will lend directly to graduate students of a CDLC academic institution.
- 3c. The library will lend directly to undergraduate students of a CDLC academic institution.
4. The library will lend directly to high school students enrolled in Advanced Placement classes.

Borrower Categories:

1. All adult borrowers 19 years of age or older.
2. Professional researcher patrons of a CDLC library (i.e. possessing academic degrees or engaged in research).
- 3a. Faculty/staff of a CDLC academic institution.
- 3b. Graduate students of a CDLC academic institution.
- 3c. Undergraduate students of a CDLC academic institution.
4. High school students enrolled in Advanced Placement classes.
